Oldfield Middle School Hosts WW II Veterans

Seventh and Eight Grade Students at Oldfield Middle school had a chance to learn history from those who helped to make history.

Legionnaires Milton Blackman, Mike Bonchonsky and Domenick Gargiulo spoke to the students of Mr. Jeffrey Shade's social studies classes on November 9th and 10th, describing their experiences in the European and Pacific Theaters of World War II. They were accompanied by Commander Bob Santo and Sgt. at Arms Charlie Armstrong.

Domenick, a highly decorated veteran of the China-Burma-India Theater talked about his tour as a flight engineer for three years aboard C-46 transports flying missions over the Himalayan Mountains, in support of the Chinese in their war with Japan. Dom was awarded the Air Medal and the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Mike described his experiences as an armorer for Martin Marauder B-26 medium bombers in North Africa, Italy and during the liberation of France in 1944. Mike was recently awarded the French Jubilee of Liberty Medal by the government of France for his role in the Liberation of that country at a ceremony of the Air Force Association.

Milton, a member of the famed 82nd Airborne Division, described the brutal conditions of the Battle of the Bulge during the winter of 1944-1945. This battle was the last major offensive mounted by the Nazis. Milton was wounded in action and received the Purple Heart in recognition of his sacrifice.

The students seemed interested in all aspects of the life of a soldier in wartime: the deprivation, homesickness, cold, heat, boredom and terror experienced by those both on the front lines and rear echelon. They seemed surprised by how young these men were when they were called to defend their country.

Our veterans were impressed by the students and their questions and were touched by the many thank you cards they were given by the children after their presentation.

We hope that Oldfield Middle School invites us again next year. We have many veterans who would be glad to share their stories with the students.

Greenlawn Post Retires Hundreds of Flags

Our Old Glory Flag Box has served as a depository for so many flags this year, that we have had to have two ceremonies in order to retire the nearly 1,000 flags we have collected so far this year. At our June ceremony, over 500 flags were retired.

We were joined by several Boy Scouts and their families at the ceremony, and they assisted us in carrying to the burn barrel, the worn, faded and no longer serviceable flags. Assistant Chief Mike Zeis insured that no one was placed at risk of burns or smoke inhalation.

Our Old Glory Flag Box has been on an extensive tour of the community this year, spending time at numerous schools, public libraries and businesses, affording the public a means to dispose of their old flags in a respectful manner. The Flag Box will be on display from January 3rd to January 31st in the lobby of half Hollow Hills Library on Vanderbilt Parkway and from February 1st through March 5 at the half Hollow Hills Library on Sweet Hollow Rd. in Melville. In March, we will once again, be bringing Old Glory to many of our local schools.

NEED A JOB? CHECK OUT THE “Hire Heroes Act”

This is a NEW Benefit for Unemployed Veterans

The “VOW to Hire Heroes Act of 2011” was recently signed into law. It includes a “Veterans Retraining Assistance Program for unemployed Veterans. The details of this act are still in development but it will be a joint venture between the VA and the Department of Labor (DoL).

The start date being published is July 1, 2012. The goal is to retrain Veterans. Returning Veterans have been identified as a demographic that is hardest hit by current economic conditions.



The program will offer 12 months of training assistance to unemployed Veterans.

To qualify you must

- Be between the ages of 35 and 60
- Be unemployed (as determined by DoL)
- (special consideration is provided to Veterans who have
- been unemployed for more than 26 weeks)
- Have an “other than dishonorable discharge”
- Not be eligible for any other VA education benefit program
- Not be in receipt of VA compensation due to unemployability
- Not be enrolled in a federal or state job training program

There are Limits:

- Only 45,000 will qualify during fiscal year 2012,
- An additional 54,000 between October 1, 2012, and March 31, 2014.
- Veterans may receive up to 12 months of assistance (at the full-time payment rate under the Montgomery GI Bill)
- Applications will be submitted through DoL
- Benefits are paid by VA.
- DoL will provide employment assistance to every Veteran (upon completion of their program.)
- Veterans will need to be enrolled in a VA approved program.
- The program must lead to an Associate Degree, Non-College Degree, or a Certification, and train the Veteran for a **high demand occupation.**

Dignity Vietnam Memorial Wall at Northport VAMC



Once again, we were honored to have the Dignity Vietnam Memorial Wall brought to the Town of Huntington from October 28-30. An escort of Motorcyclists including Our own American Legion Riders and Patriot Guard Riders escorted the wall from Citi Field in Queens to the Northport VA Medical Center on Monday the 24th. This was the first time it has been staged at a VA Hospital. The Wall was erected in the recently added Vietnam Veterans Memorial Garden at the hospital.

Members of our post were among the over 200 volunteers who assisted at the Wall providing hospitality, food service and other assistance to the thousands of visitors who came to pay their respects at this important and meaningful memorial to the 58,627 men and women who perished in the Vietnam War.

After the Northport VA, The Wall was transported to the Intrepid Air and Space Museum in New York City for three weeks, the first time it ever visited Manhattan.

Our First American Veterans. Don't They Deserve Better?

Barely visible from heavily trafficked Jericho Turnpike in Huntington Station, is a small cemetery officially known as "Long Swamp Cemetery." Last year, I came across this burial place on one of my walks around the area where I have lived for over thirty years. Designated as a Historic Cemetery by the Town of Huntington, the cemetery contains 55 graves, although, sadly, only four grave markers are still standing. These mark the graves of three patriots and veterans of the American Revolution: **John Carll**, **Scudder Carll** and **Joseph Ireland**. They all served in the 1st Regiment of **Minute Men**, Huntington Militia, under **Col. Josiah Smith**.

The fourth gravestone is for **Sarah**, the wife of **Robert Jarvis**. She died in November, 1780 at the age of 39. She is the daughter of another one of our American Revolutionary Patriots.

All the other gravestones have been vandalized in recent years by local youth who use the cemetery as a hangout. Beer cans and food wrappers are usually found scattered on the ground. All about are the shattered remains of what were once the beautiful gravestones of our earliest Huntington citizens. The grounds are overgrown with weeds, vines and underbrush.

I have stopped there numerous times and picked up the trash scattered near the graves of these honored dead, and I know there is at least one other anonymous citizen who I have yet to meet, who also does the same from time to time.

This hallowed ground, the final resting place of some of our first American Veterans, is no less important than our Long Island National Cemetery, Calverton National Cemetery or even Arlington National Cemetery.

With almost 60 Historic Cemeteries in the Town of Huntington, it is impossible to maintain them all as well as they should. I spoke with our Town Historian, Robert Hughes, about the conditions there. He indicated that he would be willing to work with us to restore the cemetery.

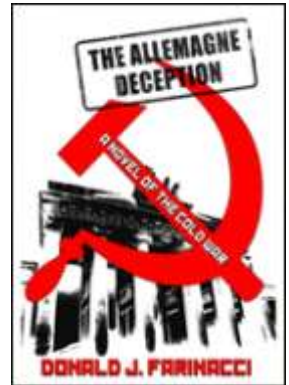
