Mike Bonchonsky Awarded Medal

Legionnaire Mike Bonchonsky was awarded the Jubilee of Liberty Medal on June 4th at the Long Island Chapter of the Air Force Association's annual Recognition and Education Awards Luncheon. Mike was one of three WW II veterans to be so honored. The medal was presented to Mike by Congressman Steve Israel at the luncheon which was held at the 56th Fighter Group Restaurant at Republic Airport. The medal, authorized by the French Government, is awarded to veterans who served in France during its liberation following the Normandy Invasion.

Mike was an armorer on B 26 Martin Marauders with the 34th Bomb Squadron, 17th Bomb Group, 9th Air Force. He is working on his memoirs and we are looking forward to reading of his experiences.

Memorial Day 2011 by Legionnaire Tireak Tulloch

I can honestly say that my Memorial weekend started the weekend before. I was in attendance at Yale University's Senior Class of 2011 closing ceremonies for my younger cousin who's going on to Harvard for medical school. On Sunday May 22nd, which was their class day, I witnessed Tom Hanks give one hell of a speech as he talked to this class. What grabbed me emotionally and stood out in my mind was his call to action to these graduates to support the new generation of returning combat veterans. His words were powerful, but the fact that he said it to a non-veteran crowd stood out even more. "Let's provide for them their place free from fear, by educating them if they can learn, by employing them as they transition from soldier back to citizen, and by empathizing with the new journey they are starting, even though we will never fully understand the journey they just completed. We all will define the true nature of our American identity not by the parades and the welcome home parties, but how we match their time in the service with service of our own."

That set the tone within me for the upcoming holiday weekend. On Friday, May 27th, I joined my fellow coworkers at LIRR's annual Memorial Day ceremony with our LIRR Veterans Association. LIRR President Helena Williams has always been a huge supporter of the annual ceremony and has been to every ceremony in her current position as agency President. After this ceremony concluded, I made my way to Calverton National Cemetery to pay my respects to Sergeant Major Mike Curtin, who was a former 1stSgt of my reserve unit of Alpha Company, 6th Communication Battalion in Amityville and a member of NYPD's ESU on that fateful day of 9/11. After rendering my salute and while heading back to my car, I came across another Marine, Sergeant James Parham, just two rows in front of the Sgt Maj. He was a member of Port Authority Police Department on that day of 9/11. I rendered my salute to him as well and hit the road. I then made my way to Long Island National Cemetery to pay my respects to Gunnery Sergeant Matthew Garvey, who to those in my unit we referred to as Gunny Highway (similar in demeanor to the character in Clint Eastwood's Heartbreak Ridge). He was the operations chief and also a member of FDNY's Squad One on that fateful day. I remember September 15, 2001 vividly as it was my 22nd birthday and while reporting into my reserve unit, I also learned of his fate as the Navy Chaplain led us in prayer.

On Sunday, May 29th, I joined my fellow American Legion members in Huntington, as the town had their ceremony with a special guest of honor. Marine 1stLt James Byler, who lost both his legs and both pinky fingers due to an IED in Afghanistan, was the hometown guest speaker. I had the honor to speak to him and his mother after the ceremony. It was funny as his mom told me she thought I was a Marine because of the way I carried myself while talking to her son. It felt good to hear that after being out for a couple of years now. The next day was just as big as I represented Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans of America on the deck of the Intrepid with the annual wreath laying ceremony. I was paired up with another Marine, NYPD Commissioner Ray Kelly as we threw the wreath honoring those we have lost in the recent wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. I also met the command staff from Marine Forces Command who came up for the event. I then ended my day in Cypress Hills cemetery attempting to find the grave of Sergeant Major Dan Daly (Two Medals of Honor and a Glen Cove native). I ran out of time as the cemetery was closing, but will find him on my next trip.

Overall, I do feel fortunate and honored to be able to participate in such ceremonies. A friend of mine told me of how she felt of me being able to go to many places for my fellow veterans. I don't consider it a vacation on any level, but a way of continuing my duty.

Correcting or replacing Military Medals and/or Records

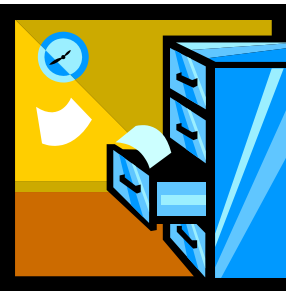
Military Medals

Medals earned while in active service are issued by the appropriate military services when requested by veterans or their next of kin. Requests for replacement medals, decorations, and awards should be directed to the Veterans' branch of the military. National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) will verify awards. Please note the processing time may be extensive, so start early. Requests are made on Standard Form 180, "Request Pertaining To Military Records," with all required documents.



Military Records

If discharge or separation documents are lost, veterans or the next of kin of deceased veterans may obtain duplicate copies by completing forms found on the Internet at www.archives.gov/research/index.html and mailing or faxing them to the NPRC. (Standard Form 180 may also be used.)



Correcting Military Records

The secretary of a military department, acting through a Board for Correction of Military Records, has authority to change any military record when necessary to correct an error or remove an injustice. A correction board may consider applications for correction of a military record, including a review of a discharge issued by court-martial.

Applications should include all available evidence, such as signed statements of witnesses or a brief of arguments supporting the correction. Application is made with DD Form 149
