Missing in America Project

John Caldarelli, our MIAP Chairman, continues to see that abandoned veterans or those with no known next of kin from New York City are buried with the military honors they earned. Since July 14, with the assistance and support of Dignity Memorial and the Mayor's Office of Veterans

Affairs, five veterans have been interred at Calverton National Cemetery:

- July 14. Oscar Patterson, US Army; 1946 - 1947. Burial Flag was presented to PGR Acting Road Captain Auprey.
- July 20. Frank Broggio, US Army 1946 -1947 and Charles E. Garrett, USMC 1969 -1979. Burial Flags were presented to Suffolk County American Legion Commander Tom Bergin and Vietnam Veteran and Dignity Memorial driver Lamont Tillot.
- September 15. Edgar Hultman, US Army 1946 -1947 and William Nelson, US Army 1967-1970. Burial Flags were presented to Patriot Guard Road Captain Frank Byrnes and to Ms. Margaret Wilson, Mr. Nelson's fiancée. Mrs. Wilson, of North Carolina, was able to attend the interment with the assistance of MIAP Chairman John Caldarelli.

Special thanks are due to all the members of the New York Patriot Guard Riders who have escorted these veterans' remains from the city and stood flag line for their final honors.

"You Earned It"

Do you have a "Presumptive" Disability? If so there are Benefits you qualify for

What is "Presumptive"?

Specific disabilities have been diagnosed in groups of certain veterans. The VA has determined these are a result of the unique circumstances of their military service. If you are a member of this group with this disability the VA presumes that the circumstances of his/her service caused the condition, and disability compensation can be awarded.



What Disability is "Presumed" to be caused by Military Service?

That depends on when and where you served so check the following lists for the group you belong to. Then check the list for that group.



Former Prisoners of War

Vietnam Veterans (Exposed to Agent Orange)

Atomic Veterans (Exposed to Ionizing Radiation)

Gulf War Veterans (Undiagnosed Illness)

In addition, Veterans diagnosed with chronic diseases (such as arthritis, diabetes, or hypertension) are encouraged to apply for disability compensation within one year of release from active duty.

Also, Veterans with 90 days or more continuous service of diagnosed (ALS)/Lou Gehrig's disease at any time after discharge are able to establish service connection for the disease.

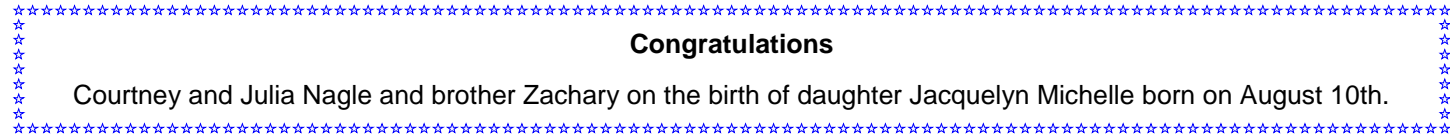

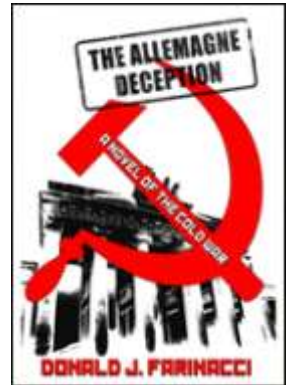
